

Estonian National Male Choir (EE)

The Estonian National Male Choir (Eesti Rahvusmeeskoor or RAM) was founded in 1944 by maestro Gustav Ernesaks, a leader of choral music in Estonia. The male choir who originally sang a cappella is now a world-renowned professional choir noted for its renditions of large-scale choral works. The choir regularly records for broadcasting companies and has collaborated with Deutsche Grammophon, Sony, Finlandia, Alba Records, Virgin Classics and GB Records. The choir's repertoire ranges from the Renaissance Period to the music of the 21st century. From the season of 2011/2012 Mikk Üleoja has acted as the principal conductor and creative director of the choir.
